

A Local Food Business Guide: Online SNAP/EBT





About

Interested in incorporating Online SNAP into your online business model but unsure where to start?

Please Note:

The information shared in this guide is based on our experience and understanding of FNS requirements. It's important to remember that SNAP approval can only be granted by FNS. Since SNAP Online is fairly new for FNS, we expect the approval process and requirements will continue to evolve. Thus, it is critical that all information be verified with USDA resources.

Eligibility



Online SNAP eligibility is evolving as more businesses embrace the program. However, it's crucial to note that the information below is not exhaustive. Even if your business model aligns with one of the eligible store types, there are additional Online SNAP requirements beyond store type that FNS considers in their decision-making process. Approval can only be granted by FNS, so it's advisable to thoroughly review the resources available on their [website](#) and seek guidance from them regarding eligibility.



Eligibility



The following FNS Store Types have the most straight forward path for Online SNAP eligibility.

Direct Marketing Farmers (DF)

The DF Store Type designation applies to individual producers of agricultural products, including fresh fruit and vegetables, meat, grains, etc., that are sold through venue such as a farm stand, pick-your own operation, and/or stall within a farmers' market.



Non-Profit Food Buying Cooperatives

This FNS store type includes any store that is a non-profit consisting of members that collectively purchase their food.



Eligibility



The following FNS Store Types have the most straight forward path for Online SNAP eligibility.

Stores



Food hubs and farms designated as a “Store” are usually sub-categorized as “Specialty Food Stores” or “Small Grocery Stores” with stocking requirements met under Criterion B (more than 50% of total gross sales in staple foods).

Delivery Route

The Delivery Route designation is for businesses that do not have a permanent store location.

FNS has begun approving Delivery Route Store Types to accept Online SNAP — paving the way for others! Although, it is important to remember that FNS looks at each business on a case-by-case basis to determine eligibility.



Note:

Many food hubs operate as Delivery Routes.



Eligibility



The following FNS Store Type currently has a slower path forward to approval.

Online Only Retailers

Recently, FNS approved the very first online-only merchant to accept SNAP EBT payments online! Since this is a recent development, the details and eligibility status are still evolving. Thus, online only retailers should expect longer approval times.



Please Note: Online Only designations are intended for businesses that only transact online. If you accept sales in person, you will need to first become a SNAP Retailer under another Store Type.



Eligibility



The following FNS Store Type currently does not qualify for Online SNAP eligibility.

Farmers Markets

Most Farmers Markets do not own the inventory sold at the market, thus making the business ineligible for Online SNAP. If your business falls under this category, there is not currently a path forward for Online SNAP eligibility.



Some non-profit Farmers Markets/Food Hubs that operate farm box models have applied as a Non-Profit Buying Cooperative for that sales channel. Although, it's important to note that this designation only applies to sales of the farm box that include products that are pre-purchased from producers.



Eligibility

Approaches to Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) and SNAP Online



CSA and subscription sales models will need to be altered to allow SNAP customers to order AND pay online.

Subscriptions, CSA, and retail models with auto-renew/auto-pay features cannot be paid with online SNAP. Instead, merchants must enable customers that pay with SNAP benefits to make one-time, ala carte purchases. Customers that pay with SNAP benefits will be responsible for logging in online to order and authorize each purchase.



LFM allows products in the storefront to be listed as “ala carte” items. Additionally, LFM’s “Bundles” Feature allows for CSA style pre-assembled boxes/bags to be sold, with or without add-ons.





INVENTORY REQUIREMENTS

Per FNS in-store SNAP requirements, all authorized in-store SNAP retailers are required to have certain stocking requirements and offer a certain range of products. Specific inventory requirements vary based on Store Type.

Model One: Loyalty/Credit Model

LFM currently supports a SNAP Match model where credit is earned on SNAP payments to be used on a future transaction toward SNAP Match eligible products.



Model Two: Discount Model (Coming April 2024)

This SNAP Match model allows customers to use a discount code on their current order.

Note:

The discount code will only be applied to orders that have Online SNAP/EBT selected as the payment preference by the customer, and the discount will only be eligible for items designated as SNAP Match eligible.
